Our revenue increased this year thanks to Capital Campaign contributions that are helping us expand our capacity and programs over the next two years. We are so grateful for your investment in our future!



At the end of this year, our Capital Campaign will be complete thanks to you!

Through this increased fundraising effort, we have added needed capacity and resources in the past year:

- We added key administrative staff, including Finance & HR Director, Kate Pinyavan, and Communications & Recruitment Coordinator, Abby Schmeichel.
- We hired experienced instructor Katie Gibbons, to be our Early Childhood Coordinator, promoted Craig Diaz, to Middle Childhood Coordinator, and will soon hire another program coordinator to help expand our teen programs.
- We created a new staff category called "Per Diem+" to provide a year-round commitment for select instructors, which includes increased benefits.
- We bought a van to transport our high school interns! Securing this transportation allowed us to accept more interns than anticipated.



 We completed the buildout of our Welcome Center and entrance to the Rock Haven land, including beautiful new signage.

Our Screech Owl camp (for 4-7 year olds) returned and completely filled!



Our summer was filled with two new programs following the conclusion of summer camp. Cooking with Fire and Sweet Fern Family Camp were intimate overnight programs at Rock Haven that allowed participants to make new friends and connect with existing ones.



We held the first Acorn Gathering for 100+ people at the Rock Haven land in Kerhonkson.



Our Using the Whole Deer adult program created enough interest for us to develop two other programs - Hide Tanningand the newly launched Buckskin Sewing.



This summer, we held a program for over 100 new college students from SUNY New Paltz's Educational Opportunity Program (EOP). Many of these students are the first in their families to attend college. It was an honor to welcome them to the Hudson Valley and connect them to an environment outside of their college campus.



We also resumed our fall field trips for every 5th grader in the Kingston City School District. Students travel with their teachers and guidance counselors to Juniper Flats, land stewarded by Scenic Hudson, for an all-day field trip in the woods. Receiving thank you letters after the field trips is all the motivation we need!

We are heading into this 20th year with a strong team and a clear direction! There are many accomplishments from this last year that highlight how well prepared we are for the next 20 years.
